**The Results Release Day of
the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination on 15 July 2026**

Summary

This circular memorandum aims to introduce the information and support measures for Secondary 6 (S6) students and related stakeholders provided by the Education Bureau (EDB) so as to assist schools to prepare for the results release day of the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination on 15 July 2026.

Details

2. To help S6 students continue with further studies and/ or work, schools are advised to prepare for the results release and support their students continuously prior to and after the HKDSE Examination results release day.

3. The EDB has updated the content of the “Designated Webpage for Secondary 6 Students” website and its “Reminders for 2026 HKDSE Exam and Exam Results Release” infographics to provide S6 students, parents and schools with the latest information on multiple pathways and important details on support measures and counselling services. Moreover, S6 students and parents can search for matching local programme information including degrees, sub-degrees, the Diploma of Applied Education, etc. at the “e-Navigator” website in formulating appropriate plans for further studies.

Preparation for the 2026 HKDSE Examination Results Release Day and Multiple Pathways for S6 Students

1. Preparation for the 2026 HKDSE Examination results release day


The EDB provides S6 students, parents and schools with support measures as below to facilitate their early preparation for the results release day.

- *“Designated Webpage for Secondary 6 Students”*: S6 students and parents can obtain the latest information on the examination results release day, local/ non-local further studies, multiple pathways, counselling and support services, etc. at this one-stop website (www.edb.gov.hk/s6/en) and its “Reminders for 2026 HKDSE Exam and Exam Results Release” infographics. 
- *“e-Navigator”*: S6 students and parents can input their predicted or actual HKDSE Examination results at this website (<https://enavigator.edb.hkedcity.net/main/index.php?lang=en>) to search for matching local programme information including degrees, sub-degrees, the Diploma of Applied Education, etc. to formulate appropriate plans for further studies. 
- *Parents’ Seminar on “Get Prepared for the HKDSE Examination Results Release - the Latest Information on Multiple Pathways”*: To provide updates on multiple pathways to parents of S6 students, the EDB will organise this online parents’ seminar (conducted in Cantonese only) on 10 June 2026. 2.1 Articulation to local degree programmes	
Admission requirements for local undergraduate programmes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="603 584 1425 1122">• The general entrance requirements (GER) of University Grants Committee-funded undergraduate programmes are set at the Level of “332A” in the four core subjects in the HKDSE Examination¹, plus Level 2 or 3 in two elective subjects. In addition to the GER, institutions may also set other admission requirements in consideration of the nature and needs of specific programmes such as designated/priority subjects, total number of elective subjects, required results in specific subject(s). Regarding details of the Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS), please visit the JUPAS website (www.jupas.edu.hk/en).  <li data-bbox="603 1167 1425 1496">• For non-Chinese speaking (NCS) students who have fulfilled the specified circumstances², all institutions will continue to accept alternative Chinese qualifications including those under Applied Learning Chinese (ApL(C)) (for NCS students), General Certificate of Education (GCE) Examination, General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) Examination and International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) Examination.


¹ “332A” refers to Level 3 in Chinese Language and English Language, Level 2 in Mathematics and “Attained” in Citizenship and Social Development.

² The specified circumstances refer to:




(a) Students who have learned Chinese Language for less than 6 years while receiving primary and secondary education; or
 (b) Students who have learned Chinese Language for 6 years or more in schools, but have been taught an adapted and simpler Chinese Language curriculum not normally applicable to the majority of students in local schools. Their entrance requirements include Level of “332A” in the four core subjects in the HKDSE Examination¹, plus Level 2 or 3 in at least one elective subject. 2.2 Articulation to Chinese Mainland higher education institutions	
<p>Admission to Chinese Mainland higher education institutions</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students can continue to apply to Chinese Mainland higher education institutions through the “Scheme for Admission of Hong Kong Students to Mainland Higher Education Institutions” (“Admission Scheme”) without needing to sit the Joint Entrance Examination for Universities on the Chinese Mainland. In the 2026/27 academic year, 165 Chinese Mainland higher education institutions participating in the “Admission Scheme” will admit Hong Kong students based on their HKDSE Examination results. The minimum entrance requirement for participating institutions under the “Admission Scheme” is “332A”¹. Institutions may also admit students nominated under the School Principal Nomination Scheme according to the relevant minimum entrance requirement, i.e. “Attained” in Citizenship and Social Development and a total score of 8 or above in the other three core subjects (Chinese Language, English Language and Mathematics), with none of them scores below Level 2. The online application and confirmation process for the “Admission Scheme” was completed last December and in February this year respectively. Institutions are tentatively scheduled to announce their admission results in late July and conduct supplementary enrolment according to the enrolment situation.

2.3 Articulation to local sub-degree programmes, Vocational Training Council (VTC) programmes and appointment in the civil service

(a)	<p>Articulation arrangements & curriculum design for Associate Degrees, Higher Diplomas and VTC programmes</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There will be about 28 600 places available for admission to sub-degree programmes (including around 8 600 subsidised Higher Diploma places to be offered by the VTC which are covered below) for the 2026/27 academic year. Students may also pursue other further education programmes under the multiple entry and exit pathways which best suit their aspirations and abilities. The VTC will offer around 14 500 places in the 2026/27 academic year, including Bachelor’s Degree, Higher Diploma, Diploma of Foundation Studies, Diploma of Vocational Education, and hospitality and culinary-related Diploma/ Certificate programmes. (b)	<p>Diploma of Applied Education</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Diploma of Applied Education Programme provides an alternative pathway for S6 school leavers as well as adult learners aged 21 or above to obtain a formal qualification to pursue employment and further study. Students can apply for admission to the full-time programme for the 2026/27 academic year through a web-based application system at www.dae.edu.hk (Chinese version only) by 4 pm, 13 July 2026. The latest details of the programme and application procedure are available at the above application website (www.dae.edu.hk) or the “Diploma of Applied Education Programme” website of the EDB (www.edb.gov.hk/en/edu-system/other-edu-training/vocational-other-edu-program/diploma).  

(c)	Apprenticeship Training	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • S6 school leavers may consider joining apprenticeship training as overseen by the Office of the Director of Apprenticeship under the VTC to undergo 3 to 4 years of structured training. While working, the apprentices will be fully subsidised by their employers to pursue relevant programmes of study through part-time day release. This enables them to receive stable salary, training allowances and recognised qualifications on one hand, and gain hands-on workplace experience and progressively move towards becoming professionals on the other hand. For details, please refer to the programme website (https://apprenticeship.vtc.edu.hk/en).  • Some employers may support their apprentices in joining the VTC Earn and Learn Scheme (The Scheme). Apart from the above benefits, eligible apprentices will also be provided with additional financial subsidies up to the amount of HK\$120,800. (d)	Qualification requirements for civil service appointments	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Government announced in September 2023 and May 2025 respectively that the HKDSE Examination results of “Attained” in the Citizenship and Social Development (as from the 2024 HKDSE Examination) and the specific examination grades / language proficiency levels attained in Category C Other Languages (OL) examinations³ (as from the 2025 HKDSE Examination) are accepted as meeting the entry requirements of relevant civil service grades. 2.4 Arrangements for repeaters

Arrangements for repeaters	<ul style="list-style-type: none">The EDB reiterates that repeating S6 is not a desirable choice as multiple pathways are provided for the secondary school leavers. However, schools are allowed to admit S6 students of their own or from other schools who wish to repeat S6, should the repetition rate of the whole school not exceed the 5% repeater quota. Under normal circumstances, schools should not allow too many students to repeat at a certain level. A list of schools admitting S6 repeaters from other schools, subjects offered and admission requirements will be released in mid-July at the Life Planning Information Website of the EDB (lifeplanning.edb.gov.hk/en/) and the “Designated Webpage for Secondary 6 Students” website (www.edb.gov.hk/s6/en).
